COURT CASES – Introduction and Implementation of **Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS)** developed by National Informatics Centre, Bihar in the State of Telangana – Orders – Issued.

ORDER:

The Government of Telangana recognizes the critical importance of effective monitoring and expeditious disposal of court cases involving the State Government. It has been observed that the absence of a centralized system for case tracking and monitoring has resulted in delays in the filing of counter-affidavits, inadequate follow-up, and instances of non-compliance with court directions. To address these challenges and strengthen the litigation management framework, the Government has decided to introduce a comprehensive Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS).

2. In order to streamline case Monitoring and strengthen the monitoring mechanism, the Government has decided to adopt the Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS) developed by the National Informatics Centre (NIC), Bihar, which is already under successful implementation in that State.

3. The CCMS provides a centralized digital platform with features such as:

- Real-time monitoring of cases pertaining to all Government Departments.
- Automated alerts and reminders regarding hearings, filing of counter-affidavits, and compliance deadlines.
- Dashboards for Secretaries and Law Officers to track progress of individual cases.
- Online updation of case status and uploading of pleadings and judgments.
- Generation of Management Information System (MIS) reports on pendency, disposal, and compliance for senior monitoring.

4. The Committee of Secretaries constituted by the Chief Secretary comprising the Secretary to Government, Legal Affairs, Legislative Affairs and Justice, Law Department, Secretary to Government, Revenue Department, and the Special Chief Secretary to Government, Home Department recommended that, adoption of CCMS will significantly strengthen the Government's ability to monitor and manage litigation, reduce delays, and ensure timely compliance with Court directions.

5. Government after careful consideration of the recommendations of the Committee of Secretaries to Government vide their report, dated 22.08.2025 decided as follows:-

- a) The Court Case Monitoring System (CCMS) developed by the National Informatics Centre, Bihar, shall be adopted and implemented in the State of Telangana.
- b) The Law Department shall function as the Nodal Department for implementation of CCMS.
- c) The Revenue Department, Home Department and Higher Education Department are identified for pilot rollout of the CCMS, following which it will be extended to all Government Departments.
- d) The Information Technology, Electronics and Communications Department shall provide necessary technical infrastructure and support, in coordination with NIC, for successful installation, hosting, and operation of CCMS.
- e) All Departments shall take up digitization of legacy cases and ongoing cases in coordination with the Advocate General's Office and Government Pleaders Office to ensure effective integration with CCMS.

6. The Registrar (IT-cum-CPC), High Court of Telangana, shall be requested to provide NAPIX API credentials to enable seamless integration of CCMS with the High Court Case Information System (CIS).

7. The Law Department, in coordination with ITE & C Department and National Informatics Centre, Telangana shall take immediate steps for pilot rollout and subsequently expand CCMS to all Departments. Periodic progress reports shall be submitted to the Chief Secretary.
